Welfare modernisation is a key and controversial reform for the Government. The hotly debated Green Paper, A New Deal for Welfare: Empowering People to Work heralds significant changes, with far-reaching implications for large portions of the population.

A clear link exists between benefits dependency and pockets of deprivation. Furthermore, research indicates that 9 out of 10 people who come on to Incapacity Benefit expect to get back into work, but a very large number never do. Shockingly, after two years on Incapacity Benefit, a person is more likely to die or retire than to find a new job. Wasting such potential is bad for the economy, but also detrimental for the individuals who want to work.
